THE McCRONE PROMISING FACULTY SCHOLARS AWARD

The Office for Research Graduate Studies & International Programs and the Humboldt State University Sponsored Programs Foundation are pleased to request nominations for the McCrone Promising Scholars Award for HSU faculty members. This award will recognize HSU's newer faculty, acknowledge their potential and encourage their continued achievement.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: Tenured/Tenure track faculty members from all fields who have received their terminal degrees within the last seven years and who are actively involved in research, scholarship and creative activities are eligible. Nominations for the award are sought from the campus community and will consist of a letter (no more than two pages, please) indicating the nominee's qualifications for the award. Eligible faculty may self-nominate.

SELECTION PROCESS: Please submit a nomination letter to the Office for Research & Graduate Studies, (Siemens Hall 129). Nominees will be notified and invited to submit to that office a current curriculum vitae and a brief (no more than two pages) statement about their current and anticipated creative activities, research & scholarship. A committee including previous Scholars of the Year will select up to three award recipients.

AMOUNT OF THE AWARD: Each award will be made for \$2,000. Awards are to be used to assist the scholar in supporting his/her program of creative activity, scholarship or research. A brief report on the use of the funding is to be submitted within 12 months to the Office for Research & Graduate Studies.

DEADLINES: Letters of Nomination are due in the Office for Research & Graduate Studies by Tuesday, February 27, 2007. Awards will be presented at a reception hosted by the HSU Sponsored Program Foundation, (date will be announced to the campus, at a later date).
