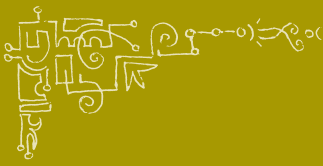


DEADLINES FOR FALL 2010 FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN APPLICANTS

EVENT	WHO NEEDS TO MEET THIS DEADLINE? WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?
<p>JANUARY 1, 2010 First day to submit FAFSA (financial aid application) fafsa.gov</p>	<p>Anyone interested in applying for financial aid or scholarships should submit the FAFSA. Priority deadline for FAFSA <i>submission</i> is March 2, 2010.</p>
<p>FEBRUARY 22, 2010 Official high school transcripts (with Fall 2009 grades) and test scores must be received in Admissions Office.</p> <p>Office of Admissions, Incoming Transcripts 1 Harpst Street, Arcata, CA 95521</p>	<p>First-time freshmen who have not already been admitted to the university. (If you've already been admitted, wait until your final transcript with your Date of Graduation is ready.)</p> <p>Note: Check your Student Center account "To Do" lists to see what we're waiting for. welcome.humboldt.edu/studentcenter</p> <p>WARNING: Your application to HSU will be cancelled if you do not meet this deadline.</p>
<p>MARCH 1, 2010 Housing and Dining Office begins notifying applicants that their Online License is available.</p>	<p>Email sent to anyone who has 1) been admitted to the university and 2) completed the housing application at humboldt.edu/housing</p>

<p>APRIL 9-10, 2010 Humboldt Preview – Our Open House event</p> <p>APRIL 16, 2010 Last day to register to take English and Math Placement tests for May 1 test date.</p> <p>More information on these tests, including test exemptions and information for out-of-state applicants, is available at: ets.org/csu</p>	<p>Applicants and their families – an invitation will be sent to you in the spring; this event is optional.</p> <p>Admitted applicants who are not exempt from the English Placement Test (EPT) and/or the Entry Level Math exam (ELM).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Personalized communications will be sent to all admitted applicants who need to take one or both of these tests. • First-time Freshmen admitted to EOP should refer to the Summer Bridge Packet regarding the ELM and EPT exams. <p>WARNING: Students who have not taken required EPT and/or ELM examinations will not be allowed to register for courses at HSU.</p>

<p>MAY 1, 2010 Last day for admitted applicants to confirm intention to enroll at HSU. welcome.humboldt.edu/studentcenter or email apply@humboldt.edu</p>	<p>Admitted applicants planning on enrolling at HSU.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Log into your Student Center (see above) and accept your offer of admission. <p>WARNING: Your admission to HSU will be revoked if you do not meet this deadline.</p>
<p>JUNE 4, 2010 Last day to sign up for an Orientation Session.</p> <p>Participation in an orientation session is <i>mandatory</i>.</p> <p>First-time freshmen admitted to EOP must attend Summer Bridge Orientation session (see EOP Acceptance letter).</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Separate communications regarding specific orientation sessions, dates and how to sign up will be sent in March.Students without official EPT/ELM scores or exemptions will not be able to register for classes.Students are required to provide immunization records before registering for classes: studentaffairs.humboldt.edu/health/immunization_requirements.php <p>WARNING: Your admission to HSU will be revoked if you do not meet this deadline.</p>
<p>JULY 16, 2010 Final, official high school transcript must be received (no faxes allowed).</p> <p>Office of Admissions, Incoming Transcripts 1 Harpst Street, Arcata, CA 95521</p>	<p>Admitted First-time Freshmen.</p> <p>Communications will be sent to remind you of this deadline. You must make the arrangements with your high school for this document to be sent. Make arrangements early if your high school will be closed for summer – No exceptions to this deadline!</p> <p>WARNING: Your admission to HSU will be revoked if you do not meet this deadline.</p>
<p>JULY 16, 2010 Official college transcripts showing Spring 2010 grades, if you were enrolled Spring 2010.</p>	<p>First-time Freshmen who took college courses.</p> <p>WARNING: Your admission to HSU will be revoked if you do not meet this deadline.</p>

Very Important Reminders

- You must meet all admission requirements, as well as all the deadlines listed above, or your admission will be revoked.
- You will not be allowed to “make up” coursework during the summer. For example, if you get a “D” in English (or any other required course) in your senior year, so that you no longer meet the minimum requirement for that subject area, we will revoke your admission – **you cannot take a summer course to make up any deficiencies.**
- Many applicants were provisionally admitted on the basis of their self-reported courses, grades and test scores. If your final official transcripts and test scores show that you do not meet the requirements for admission, your admission will be revoked. We do not use “mid-year” transcripts for the final evaluation.
