Social Justice Action, Teaching & Research

This special issue of the *Humboldt Journal of Social Relations* (HJSR) is a window into contemporary social justice action, teaching and research. The issue will feature work from faculty members and grassroots organizers. In addition, a section of this issue will feature submissions from undergraduate students. Invited authors will provide a theoretical and historical framework. We envision this issue as a potential stand-alone resource for both undergraduate and graduate education in community organizing, social movements and social justice-related action courses. Submissions are due on August 15, 2011 and invited in the following areas:

1. Undergraduate Social Justice Action – Open Themes
2. Undergraduate Social Justice Action – The Arts as Mediums for Social Justice Action
3. Open Submissions – Social Justice Action, Teaching & Research and/or The Arts as Mediums

Authorship: All authors are encouraged to collaborate with others inside or outside academia. Interdisciplinary submissions are welcome. The lead author on the undergraduate submissions must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student or a student who graduated in May 2010 or later. In the latter case, a substantial portion of the action work discussed in the submission should have taken place during undergraduate enrollment. Undergraduates are encouraged to work closely with a faculty member.

Article Forms: Articles should discuss relevant literature. In addition, authors should “tell their story” describing in detail the social action work and provide reflections on the experiences. Include discussion of issues encountered in the action work and the avenues for resolution. Research-based submissions, such as a participatory action research piece, should include a discussion of method and data, as well as the other areas noted above.

Manuscript Submission:

1. Manuscripts should be in 12 point font, doubled spaced and generally not exceed 8500 words. To facilitate blind review, authors should incorporate a cover page that includes an article title, author contact information, a 75 word or less biographical statement and a 150 word or less abstract. Format citations, tables, figures & references using American Sociological Association style.
2. Email hjsr@humboldt.edu with the message subject “HJSR: Justice Submission” and attach your submission in .doc, docx or .rtf format.
3. Via overland mail send a check for \$15 made out to “HJSR” including a note with your contact information and the date on which you sent your electronic submission.
4. Submission implies commitment to publish in HJSR. Authors should not simultaneously submit to another journal. Manuscripts should not have been published elsewhere.
