**Description:** The Department of Anthropology invites applications for a one-semester full-time temporary position in Archaeology starting on January 13, 2010 and ending May 19, 2010. The successful candidate may also develop an archaeological field school in collaboration with the University Extension program during summer 2010. Consideration for a subsequent reappointment for academic year 2010-11 will be contingent upon satisfactory performance evaluation, budget, and/or enrollment and programmatic need.

**Professional Qualifications:** The Department of Anthropology seeks an archaeologist with demonstrated teaching and field training effectiveness. A Ph.D. in anthropology or archaeology from an accredited college or university is required at the time of appointment. Experience in the archaeology of the Western United States, California and North Coast prehistory, GIS, and lithic analysis is desirable. Candidates must be prepared to mentor students, show commitment to teaching excellence, and teach a broad range of courses to diverse students (majors, general education, non-traditional students, etc.). Candidates are expected to demonstrate their capacity to prepare individuals to function in a culturally and ethnically diverse society. Candidates must demonstrate hands-on experience in contract archaeology. **Professional Duties:** The successful candidate will coordinate student involvement in local field and laboratory projects and effectively train undergraduates in the field, laboratory, and classroom. The successful candidate will also be assigned administrative responsibilities in HSU's Cultural Resources facility. Teaching responsibilities will include undergraduate classes on cultural resources management (CRM) archaeology and methods classes on existing and emerging technologies. Teaching duties may include CRM/Collections, historical archaeology, museum studies, archaeology lab, field studies, and other areas according to expertise, depending upon course availability, budget, and enrollment. Instructional assignments will be consistent with the programmatic needs of the department and students.
