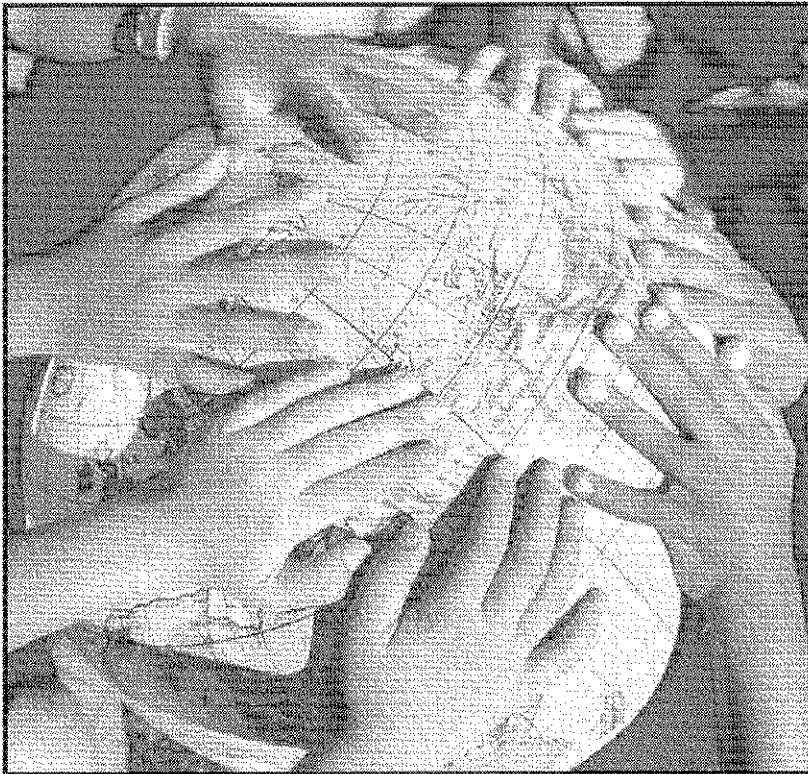

Phil Gersmehl is a nationally recognized speaker and author regarding geographic literacy and the teaching of geography. He is the Director of the New York Center for Geographic Learning and a Professor of Geography at Hunter College, City University of New York.

The workshop will have break-out sessions that include Geography K-4, Geography/ History-Social Studies 5-8, Geography/ Environmental Science 5-12, and Geography/ History-Social Studies 9-12.
