Description

Humboldt State University invites nominations and applications for the position of Associate Dean for Marine Science. The Associate Dean for Marine Science, working closely with marine science faculty, is responsible for 1) coordination, promotion, management and development of marine science facilities, and 2) for providing institutional visibility and leadership for HSU marine sciences. The Associate Dean is expected to generate funds to support marine science programs and facilities. The Associate Dean has facilities management responsibilities for the HSU Marine Laboratory, an interdisciplinary instructional and research facility, and the vessel fleet (including several small boats and the 90 ft oceangoing RV Coral Sea). Promotion and development of marine science education and research will be achieved through a cooperative effort with other institutions or agencies and by representation at various state, regional, and national boards and associations. The Associate Dean reports to the Dean of the College of Natural Resources and Sciences.

Humboldt State University, located in the rural redwood forest region of the California coastal range, is the northernmost of the 23 campuses of the California State University. A faculty of over 400 works with approximately 7,500 students. Minimum Qualifications

Ph.D. in marine science-related scientific discipline. Significant record of accomplishment in obtaining and administering grants and/or contracts. Work experience in higher education comparable to a tenured faculty appointment. Evidence of commitment to an academic institutional environment that combines undergraduate teaching excellence with collaborative research endeavors involving academic and government scientists. Knowledge of standard oceanographic equipment and large vessel operation required. Ability to work with faculty, staff, and management personnel representing diverse and competing interests.

Compensation

The position is a full-time, twelve-month appointment. The position is covered by the California State University Management Personnel Plan, and has an excellent benefits package. Under this plan, incumbents are subject to normal management reviews and serve at the pleasure of the University President. Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience and qualifications.
