Hours: Classes run Monday – Friday. Program assistants preferably arrive 10 minutes early and stay after for about 10 minutes. Assistants can help with one or more classes depending on volunteer’s availability and preference or if you are completing an internship. These classes * meet off-site (within 7 miles of museum).

Benefits: Experience working with children in a non-traditional learning environment, work alongside experienced teachers and naturalists and earn a positive reference upon successful completion. Interns also earn other benefits including a Museum membership (value \$55), discounts in the store, and stipend of \$100. (Interns are also invited to the summer beach party midway through the season.)

Qualifications: Must like children and have at least one year of experience with children ages 4 to 12. The volunteer is extremely important to the class so be prepared to make a serious commitment to being there each day. Assistants need to be able to take direction as well as able to anticipate needs. Must be reliable, have a good attitude and communicate well. Possible tasks include setting up activities, helping with clean-up, gathering supplies, and supervising small groups for small amounts of time.

High school student interns must obtain work permit.
