Richard Van Camp is a proud member of the [Dogrib \(Tlicho\)](#) Nation from Fort Smith, NWT, Canada. Richard currently teaches Creative Writing with an Aboriginal Focus at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver, BC. He was recently awarded "Wordcraft Storyteller of the Year" in 2006-2007 for "the greatest storytelling in Canada and the US."

Richard is the author of children's books with the [Cree](#) artist, George Littlechild, *A Man Called Raven* and *What's the Most Beautiful Thing You Know About Horses?*, a novel, *The Lesser Blessed*, and a collection of his finest short stories, *Angel Wing Splash Pattern*.
