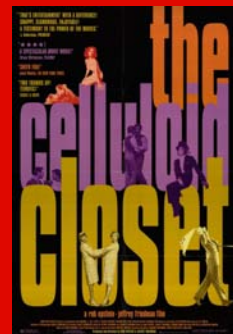

8 pm "Junjou Romantica"

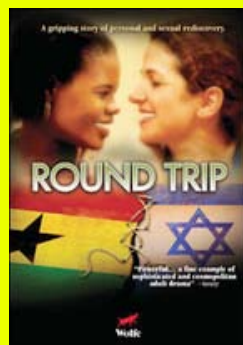

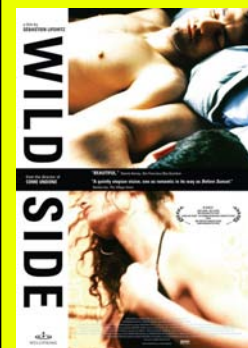
5 pm "Round Trip"

A divorced Israeli woman hires a single African woman as a nanny, and soon the two women form a passionate friendship that leads to a romantic relationship.



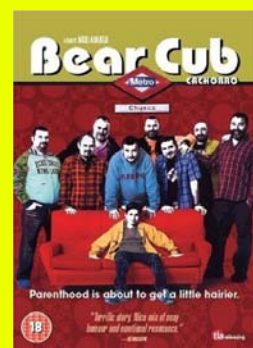

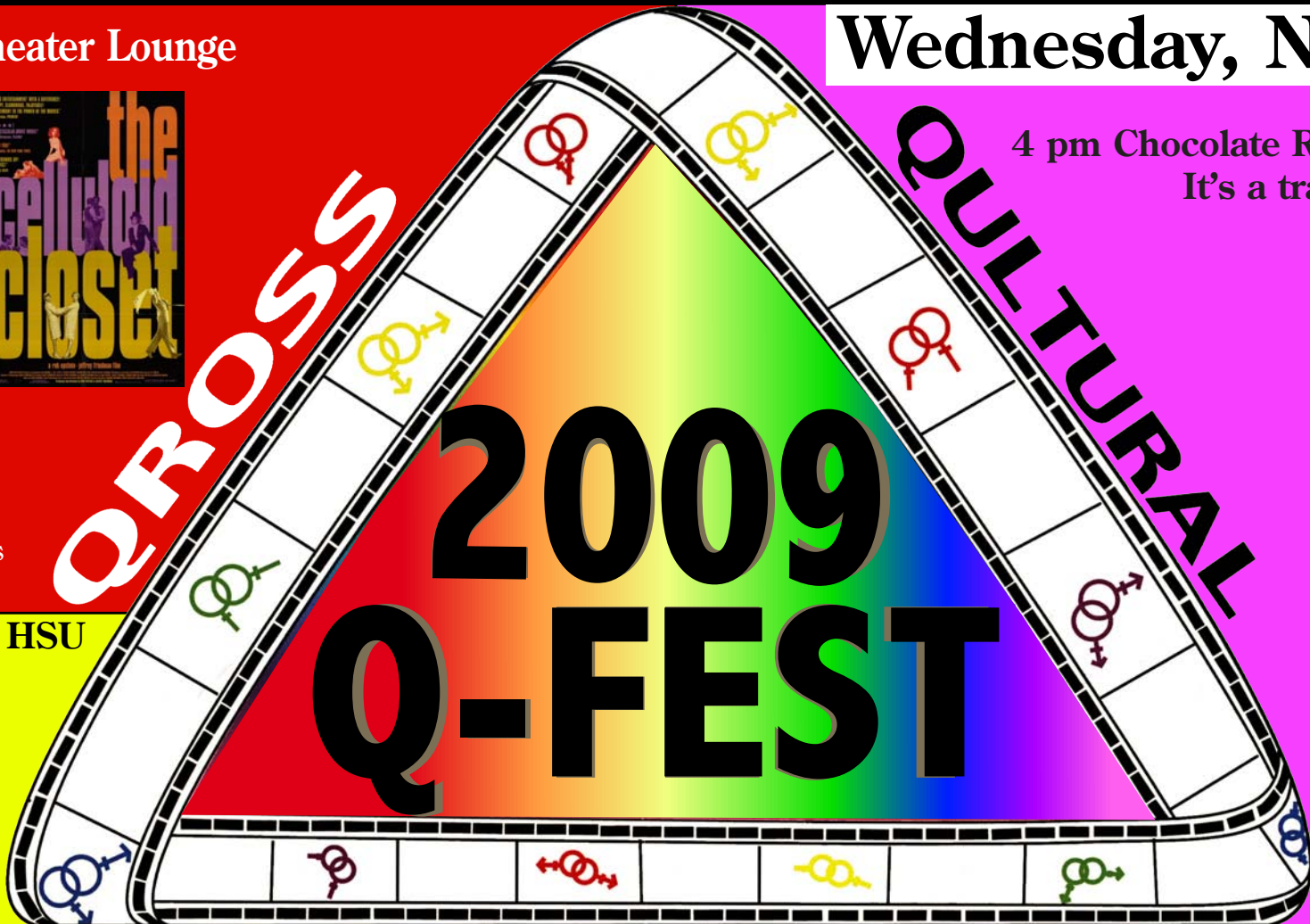
