The AS Program Budget Hearings were held on Saturday, March 5, 2011. After the hearings, the Board of Finance proceeded to discuss each programs request and developed a recommended budget for 2011-12. The recommended budget, with appropriate budget language was submitted for approval and will be distributed to the AS Council on Friday, March 11, 2011. AS Programs will also receive the 2011-12 AS Recommended Budget on March 11. On Friday, March 25, 2011 the AS Council will have a meeting to discuss the recommended budget. The Council will take action on Friday, April 1 to approve the budget or to select the programs to appear at the

next meeting on April 8. Programs will also be given an opportunity to appeal their recommended budget to Council and Council will also be given an opportunity to call in a program if they have questions about the recommendation.

The recommended budget will be forwarded to President Richmond for approval. It is hoped that anyone that has questions or comments about the budget, or the process, will contact any of the Board of Finance members prior to the April 1 meeting. A binder of the 2011-12 budget requests is available in the AS Council Office.
