
WHEREAS, there the President's Advisory Committee on Sustainability and HSU Sustainability Committee membership roster are similar; and

WHEREAS, both committees meet to discuss similar environmental efforts and provide similar advice on sustainability; and,



RESOLVED, the A.S. Board of Directors support the combination of the President's Advisory Committee on Sustainability with the HSU Sustainability Committee; and,




