DID YOU KNOW THAT THE ARCATA MARSH & WILDLIFE SANCTUARY IS HOME TO OVER 330 BIRD SPECIES, AS WELL AS A DIVERSE ARRAY OF MAMMALS, REPTILES, AMPHIBIANS, FISH, AND INSECTS? VISITORS MAY ENCOUNTER THESE ANIMALS DURING THEIR NEXT VISIT, AND CPT ENCOURAGES THE COMMUNITY TO SHARE THEIR OBSERVATIONS.



A MARSH IS A TYPE OF WETLAND — A LOW-LYING AREA THAT IS PERIODICALLY OR CONTINUOUSLY COVERED BY WATER, CHARACTERIZED BY SOFT, WATERLOGGED SOIL AND DOMINATED BY GRASSY VEGETATION SUCH AS REEDS, RUSHES, AND SEDGES RATHER THAN TREES.
