General Eligibility

- ✓ Full-time, enrolled undergraduate student
- ✓ Must have completed financial aid applications for the upcoming year
- ✓ Has high school diploma or equivalent by start of program
- ✓ Must be and remain in good academic standing
- ✓ Ability to commit to the program for the full academic year

Financial Need

Qualifies for Federal Pell Grant
OR State Cal Grant OR Middle Class Scholarship

OR

Needs to work part-time and/or borrow student loans to meet educational costs
