Nurturing a Robust Care Workforce in the Redwood Community



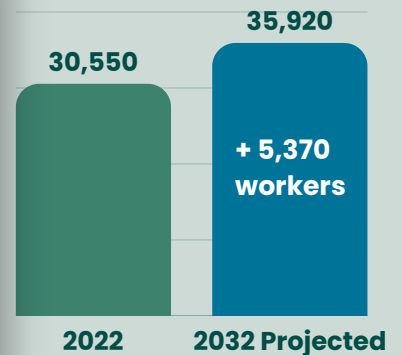
Redwood Region RISE is driving the strategy to address community needs, expand training, and strengthen access to quality care critical to the Redwood Region's future.



Ecosystem at a Glance:

- Employment growing up to 18% by 2032.
- Designated Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA).
- Shortages disproportionately impact people of color, underrepresented in healthcare workforce.
- Eldercare is a challenge and opportunity: acute demand for Home Health Aides.
- Sustained investment in workforce development is needed to meet the moment.

- **Simulation center** to deliver community health and training, which will serve **3,225+** learners and workers annually.
