# \*A Message from Cal Poly Humboldt, September 09, 2025:Understanding the Clery Act and the Annual Security Report

Each year, Cal Poly Humboldt shares our Annual Security Report (ASR) and Annual Fire Safety Report (AFSR) as required under the federal law known as the <u>Clery Act</u>. This year's <u>2025 ASR</u> and <u>2025 AFSR</u> reports, spanning the previous three calendar years, provide important information on campus safety, fire safety, crime statistics, and available support resources. What You Should Know About Our Safety Reporting:

**Reports vs. Facts:** Incidents listed in the ASR represent reports we received—not confirmed facts. We want to be transparent about what has been reported to us. Please note that these incidents aren't necessarily investigated, proven, or result in any action by law enforcement or fire safety personnel.

What Gets Reported: We're required to share incidents that:

Fall into specific categories like sexual assault, robbery, or stalking □ Happened on campus, in residence halls, nearby public areas, or University-controlled locations □ Were reported to campus officials or law enforcement

**Timing Matters:** An incident may appear in the report even if it happened in a previous year, wasn't investigated, or didn't result in legal charges or University disciplinary procedures. **Privacy is Protected:** Names or details that could identify anyone involved are never included. We are legally required to protect survivor privacy, and statistics are reported as numbers only. **When We Alert Campus:** We only send campus-wide timely warnings when an incident might pose an ongoing risk to our community's safety.
