Applicants must hold an acceptable baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution (or equivalent academic preparation); be in good academic standing at the last university attended; have a GPA of at least 3.0 in the last 60 semester units attempted (90 quarter units).

Assistantship

The College of Professional Studies Scholars Program provides paid assistantship opportunities for undergraduate, post-baccalaureate, and graduate students.

Through the program, students will work with a faculty sponsor to do supervised, faculty-led, and supported research, scholarship, and/or creative activities. Each endeavor is equivalent to approximately 33 hours of engagement.
