Academics & Options

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Two Program Pathways

Registered Nurse (RN)–BSN: Designed for students who have earned an ADN and are looking to advance their careers.*

Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) ADN–BSN: Designed for students who are just starting their nursing education with our community college partners.*

***All students must have an active, unrestricted California RN license before taking NRS 470/471.**

Program Requirements

The following requirements are needed for admission:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 in all courses
- Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) – RN–BSN only
- Pass NCLEX exam – RN–BSN only

In addition, you will need to have successfully completed the following 8 core courses:

- Written Communication (1A)
- Critical Thinking (1B)
- Oral Communication (1C)
- Chemistry: General, inorganic, organic, or integrated (with associated lab if required at the institution where the course was taken) (5A, 5B)
- Human Anatomy (with required lab)
- Human Physiology (with required lab)
- Microbiology (with required lab)
- Statistics (2)
