Students passionate about psychology come from around the world to study with our faculty. The psychology department's rigorous program is grounded in the scientific and practical experience that students need to be prepared for today's workforce and/or a postbaccalaureate degree. The psychology program will prepare students to work in various fields such as health, education, research, or business. Students are able to make connections with faculty, staff, and other students. Experience Your Learning

Students participate in several hands-on learning opportunities and earn units toward their degree.

Each year, many Psychology students attend and present their research at professional events, such as the Western Psychological Association conference.

Students complete their own project when they enroll in an independent studies course or senior honors thesis.

Academics & Options

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Psychology is a broad field comprised of many specialties and will prepare students for a broad range of careers.

Students develop highly marketable skills such as the ability to collect, organize, analyze, and interpret data; write reports; exhibit interpersonal skills; and communicate effectively. An undergraduate degree is valuable in many health, behavioral, and mental health positions, and for careers in areas such as research, human resources, management training, customer relations, college admissions, and more.

Current qualified students who are juniors can apply to be admitted to the Blended program in Academic Research. Students begin working on a Master's degree in their senior year. They will then complete their Master's degree in a final fifth year in the program. The Behavior Analysis emphasis is not available as part of the blended program.
