

# How to sign up for the CITI Training Module

## “Research with Native American Communities: Important Considerations When Applying Federal Regulations”

This webinar discusses the unique challenges presented when researchers conduct and IRBs review research that includes American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) communities. Included are essential tools to help facilitate the conduct of ethical research with AIAN communities. **The runtime is 48 minutes and 55 seconds.**

Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI)

For your research proposal to be approved, you first must complete the CITI Training.

The CITI Program is a subscription service providing research ethics education to all members of our on campus research community. The CITI course is a protected site. If you are new to the site, you must register and create your own username and password to gain access to the site.

**CAUTION:** The ONLY course that will satisfy the IRB CITI requirement is the Social & Behavioral Research-Basic/Refresher, Basic Course. This is true for undergraduate and graduate students, as well as for faculty and staff.




## Step 4: Select "Courses".


### Step 5: Go to View Courses.
