SUBJECT: 2025 Regulated Equipment & Tool Inventory and Report

On September 23, 2025, Sgt. Martin completed the Cal Poly Humboldt Police Department's (UPD) 2025 Regulated Equipment and Tool Inventory pursuant to Policy 706 and Gov. Code section 7071. This memorandum provides the 2025 inventory, which will be formally included as an appendix to Policy 706.

Of the sixteen regulated types of equipment and tools, Cal Poly Humboldt Police Department (UPD) utilizes:

- Extended Range Impact Weapon (ERIW) "Bean Bag" Shotgun
- TPI Pepper Ball brand launchers

Summary of how regulated tools and equipment were used, and the purpose of its use:

UPD did not have any cases involving the use of the Extended Range Impact Weapon "bean bag shotgun."

UPD did not have any cases involving the use of pepper ball launchers.

Summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning regulated tools and equipment:

UPD did not receive and complaints or concerns regarding the use of any of the Extended Range Impact Weapon "bean bag shotgun."

UPD did not receive any complaints or concerns regarding the use of any pepper ball launchers

Results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the regulated tools and

UPD did not receive any audit findings or information about violations associated with the regulated tools and equipment policy.

Annual cost and source of funds for regulated tools and equipment:

Total expenditures in 2025 for planned purchases to support training and readiness of the Enhanced Range Impact Weapon (ERIW) is approximately \$500. Department general funds were used to purchase the equipment.

Current inventory of regulated tools and equipment:

Four (4) TPI Pepper Ball brand launchers (in possession, no longer fielded)
Five (5) Extended Range Impact Weapon (ERIW) "Bean Bag" Shotgun
Remington Model 870, 12-gauge shotgun, pump action, standard grip

Planned purchases of additional regulated tools and equipment in 2026:

Replacement of pepper ball launchers that have been removed from service

As part of our ongoing commitment to institutional transparency and engagement with the campus community, the University Police Department will conduct a detailed presentation on AB 481 for the Campus Safety and Police Committee once the committee has been re-established.
