SUBJECT: 2026 Regulated Equipment & Tool Inventory and Report

In July 2022, pursuant to Assembly Bill 481, the California State University Board of Trustees approved a system-wide Regulated Tools and Equipment Policy for its twenty-two (22) Police Departments. This policy was adopted and published by Cal Poly Humboldt Police Department within Policy 706.

AB 481 and Policy 706 require that we publish certain information annually regarding specified regulated equipment. Of the sixteen regulated types of equipment and tools outlined in Assembly Bill 481, Cal Poly Humboldt Police Department (UPD) utilizes:

Extended Range Impact Weapon (ERIW) "Bean Bag" Shotgun TPI Pepper Ball brand launchers
Variable Kinetic System Pepper ball Launchers

Information regarding the use, policy compliance, funding, and inventory for the period of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026, are outlined below.

Summary of how regulated tools and equipment were used, and the purpose of its use:

UPD did not have any cases involving the use of the Extended Range Impact Weapon "bean bag shotgun."

UPD did not have any cases involving the use of pepper ball launchers.

Summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning regulated tools and equipment:

UPD did not receive any complaints or concerns regarding the use of any of the Extended Range Impact Weapon "bean bag shotgun."

UPD did not receive any complaints or concerns regarding the use of any pepper ball launchers.

Results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the regulated tools and equipment policy, and any actions taken in response

UPD did not receive any audit findings or information about violations associated with the regulated tools and equipment policy.

Annual cost and source of funds for regulated tools and equipment:

Total expenditures in 2025/2026 to support training and replace equipment was \$9158. Department general funds were used to purchase the equipment.

Current inventory of regulated tools and equipment:

Four (4) Variable Kinetic System Pepper ball Launchers

Five (5) Extended Range Impact Weapon (ERIW) "Bean Bag" Shotgun Remington Model 870, 12-gauge shotgun, pump action, standard grip

94 rounds Supersock CTS Model 2581 12-gauge rounds

450 Pepperball VKS Pava (OC) Powder Projectiles

50 Pepperball VXR Inert Projectiles

Four (4) TPI Pepper Ball brand launchers (in possession, no longer fielded)

2750 TPI Brand Pepperballs (anticipated to be removed from inventory)

Planned purchases of additional regulated tools and equipment in 2026:

100 Supersock CTS Model 2581 12-gauge rounds- \$1500. The department will use general funds for this purchase.

As part of our ongoing commitment to institutional transparency and engagement with the campus community, the University Police Department will conduct a detailed presentation on AB 481 at the University Senate meeting in **October 2026**. This presentation will provide the community with comprehensive information regarding AB 481 and facilitate informed discussion.
