Experience Your Learning

Studying at Humboldt means gaining real-world experience that you wouldn't get as an undergraduate at many other universities. Hands-on learning experiences are built into your core major coursework and you have the opportunity to work with faculty on their research and projects, or develop your own.

In your first year, you will begin working with real web-based data sources to answer your own social science research questions.

As part of your core service-learning course, and supported by a faculty service learning coordinator, you will pick a site on or off campus that fits with your interests and schedule.

Humboldt is home to several institutes, which can give you real world experience. They include: Altruistic Personality and Prosocial Behavior Institute, Humboldt Institute for Interdisciplinary Marijuana Research, and the California Center for Rural Policy.
