

RESOLUTION ON THE STRUCTURE OF THE  
UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE  
(#07-93/94-EP)

- WHEREAS, With the elimination of some colleges, the membership on the University Curriculum Committee (UCC) is now small so that curriculum development and oversight would benefit from an enlarged committee; and
- WHEREAS, There is a need to have better communication between the UCC and the Academic Senate;
- WHEREAS, The charge of the UCC is to take a university-wide perspective; and
- WHEREAS, It is also important to maintain the different perspectives of the Colleges; and
- WHEREAS, Students should have an opportunity to make significant input into the curriculum; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Humboldt State University recommends that the faculty vote in the Fall of 1993 on the following changes in the membership of the University Curriculum Committee as found in the Faculty Handbook so that, if approved, elections may be held in Spring, 1994 and the changes implemented in Fall, 1994:
1. Faculty membership be expanded to include two members from each college. Each college will nominate members from its college (at least two for each vacancy) which will then be elected by the University at large. College members will serve three-year overlapping terms.
  2. Student membership be expanded to include four students, one from each college, appointed by the President of the Associated Students, with the consent of the Student Legislative Council, to serve one-year terms.
  3. The chair of the UCC be an ex officio voting member of the Academic Senate and a member of the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate.
