

### One Path. Two Degrees. Less Time.

Combine your B.A. in Criminology & Justice Studies or Sociology with an M.A. in Public Sociology

#### How does the combined program work?

- Upper-division transfer students: 2+1 years coursework
- First-time students: 4+1 years coursework
- Meet with faculty advisor to develop plan that maps about 100 units completed by end of Junior year
- Take SOC 472 (1) "Graduate School Planning" Fall Junior year, where you will work on your application
- Apply to BA/MA Program in Spring semester Junior year

## What is the focus of the Masters in Public Sociology?

The curriculum focuses on social justice and environmental sustainability with advanced training in qualitative & quantitative research methods. As students move from undergraduate to graduate coursework, they choose an experience emphasis in either practicing sociology or teaching sociology. # What are advantages of doing a combined BA/MA program?

**Save Time** – Double count 12 units toward both BA and MA. Finish both degrees in just one extra year.

**Save Money -** Pay undergraduate tuition until 120 units. Then just one extra year of graduate tuition (vs. two).

**Stay Challenged** – Jump into graduate seminars early. Earn credit for both degrees.

**Boost Career –** Stand out for advanced jobs and competitive doctoral programs.

### **Eligibility**

- 3.5 Minimum GPA
- Capacity to be successful in writing intensive graduate coursework
- Completed required major coursework for admission
- No more than 90 units "completed" at admission
