

## KNOWLEDGE BASED REQUIREMENTS

### COMMUNITIES & IDENTITY

**CRIM 420. Drugs and Society**  
Social/historical process shaping drug policy  
**SOC 306. Changing Family\* + SOC. 306M. (for majors)**  
Examines family as a pivotal institution in cross-cultural and U.S. perspectives  
**SOC 308. Altruism and Compassion\* + SOC 308M. (for majors)**  
Creating a more caring society by understanding motivators  
**SOC 330. Social Deviance**  
Studying "outsiders" by virtue of age, race/ethnicity, sexuality, ability, etc.  
**SOC 411. Popular Culture**  
Popular culture as an important arena of social and political struggle.  
**SOC 475. Community Organizing**  
Theory & practical skills for organizing community in social & economic justice

### INEQUALITIES & CHANGE

**SOC 305. Global Transformations\* + SOC 305M. (for majors)**  
Economic, political, social, and ecological dimensions of globalization  
**SOC 316. Gender and Society**  
Gender dynamics from the individual to institutions and structures (*Meets a DCG requirement*)  
**SOC 321. Sociology of Sport**  
Processes, patterns, issues, and values  
**SOC 466. Migration and the Global Economy**  
Political economy of migration, criminalization, of movement  
**SOC 350. Social Movements**  
Causes, activities, successes & failures of U.S. and global social movements

### ENVIRONMENT

**SOC 302. Forests and Culture\* + SOC 302M. (for majors)**  
Relationships between human civilizations and nature/forests.  
**SOC 320. Environmental Sociology**  
Examines the dynamics of the "natural environment" and society.  
**SOC 363. Environmental Crime**  
Applying criminal justice to the natural environment; legal, social perspectives.  
**SOC 370. Environmental Inequality and Globalization**  
Examines environmental justice and inequality on a global level.

*SOC 480 courses are Special Topics course with topics that change each semester. Check the Class Schedule each semester for Special Topics. Note to transfer students: If you have a course that transfers in at fewer than 4 units, we offer 1-unit courses to supplement.*

 SOC 225S. Social Issues and Action (4 units)  
 SOC 382. Introduction to Social Research (4 units)  
 Plus 12 units of upper division soc coursework.  
*No more than one elective for your minor may be a sociology course that is also a general education course. The GE course must be taken for 4 units.*

**SOC 492. SENIOR THESIS**  
 Completing independent research on the topic of your choice

**SOC 482. INTERNSHIP**  
 Completing a hands-on work experience with a community partner
